Happy St. Patrick's Day and a Blessed Lent from the Music Room!

1.<u>Pre-K & Kindergarten:</u> In addition to St. Patrick's Day and Lenten songs, students will be performing on small instruments while singing and reading short rhythmic phrases. They are singing very well in tune using puppets for pitch direction. (See pictures below).

2. <u>**Ist and 2nd Grade:**</u> Students are studying Tempo and moving to music from the Baroque Era as well as modern Christian music. They are learning St. Patrick's Day, Lenten songs and speech poems transferring to non-pitched instruments. 2nd grade is studying the life of J.S. Bach and his struggles for freedom from the Duke of Weimar, Germany, who imprisoned him.

3. <u>**3rd Grade:**</u> Students will study Sea Shanties and Clipper ship songs. They are great multitaskers in line dancing while singing. They have mastered changing from duple to triple meter while folk dancing. They continue singing lenten and St. Patrick's Day songs and jigs.

<u>4.4th, and 5th Grades:</u> Students are doing very well performing recorder and reading on the treble clef staff B, A, G, F, E and adding low D. They are learning about measures, repeat signs, Binary form and performing jazz warm ups. (See pictures below) learning about scat singing and jazz.


