The season for illnesses is upon us. The school's community health is important to us. We follow NM Department of Health guidelines for schools. Please review the list below of some common illnesses this time of year, and what the NMDH guidelines are for a safe return to school. Flu Type A & B: Students/staff should remain home until they have been fever free without fever reducing medication for 24 hours. They should also be well enough to last the whole day at school.

Stomach Viruses with vomiting or diarrhea: Students/staff should remain home until 24 hours without these symptoms. Also, until they have been fever free without fever reducing medication for 24 hours, and are well enough to last the whole day at school.

Streptococcal Infections (Strep Throat): Students/staff must remain home until it has been 24 hours since the start of antibiotics.

Covid 19: It is recommended that students/staff remain home for 5 days. Day 0 is the day symptoms started. If symptoms do not develop, day 0 will be the day of the positive result. It is also recommended to wear a mask for an additional 5 days. The school has home Covid tests available upon request, that won't expire until February. The 5th grade attended the Rio Rancho Children's Water Festival. They learned about water conservation, treatment, and how not to contaminate water. The students also had fun while participating in educational experiments! Thank you Rio Rancho Water Authority for hosting our Pelicans!

<u>A Blessed All Saints Day & Thanksgiving Season from the Music</u> <u>Room</u>

<u>Pre-K & Kindergarten</u>: Students are singing very well on pitch and taking turns creating, leading and echoing high, medium, low sounds, short and long tones. They will sing simple Thanksgiving songs.

<u>1st-2nd Grade:</u> Students are exploring tempo and will begin singing Thankful songs including "<u>Thanks A Lot"</u>, (in swing style) and songs of peace. They enjoyed tossing bean bags to the beat while singing. (See Picture below).

<u>**3rd -4th Grade:**</u> Students are reading notes on the treble clef staff. They will learn how to create rhythm rondos to perform on body percussion and drums.

<u>5th- Grade</u>: Students are reading notes on the treble clef staff, 16th notes and syncopated rhythms.
